## YOUR LOCAL LIBRARY

#### The Library

Reading itself is essential to a child's success, but the role of libraries in child development should not be overlooked. With the technology and resources available in the world, some people question how libraries impact children today. These centers provide free resources, access to professionals, and a variety of other services that benefit children. Forming a close relationship with the local library at a young age teaches a student that these resources are available to them.

#### An Example Set by You

One of the key benefits of taking a child to the library is that you, as the parent, are establishing an example as a reader. By going to the library with your children when they're young, you can make sure they develop a sense that reading is a natural thing for people to do. When children learn from an early age that reading is an essential part of life, they develop habits that make the decision to continue reading that much easier. Forming these habits early can be one of the most important factors in gaining early access to literacy skills.

#### Freedom of Choice

Educators have found that significant improvements in motivation and student engagement occur when children are offered choices and can have some control in how they learn. In fact, researchers have

found that student learning improves when options are provided, even if the options themselves have little relevancy in how a task is completed.

Providing students with options isn't only about allowing them to choose a book on a topic they enjoy. It's also teaching them that their voice and preferences matter and that they have many options in what they read and how they interact with the material. This developmental concept is a crucial one, teaching students that they play an integral role in forming their own education and seeking out materials or topics that interest them.

Choice provides students with a solid platform on which to establish their reading preferences and develop a sense of how they define themselves as learners and readers.

#### Free Entertainment

One of the most overlooked values of the library is that it provides resources for free. This quality can be especially important during the summer months when keeping kids entertained with summer camps, family vacations, and other opportunities quickly eat into a family budget.

Libraries frequently offer events or gettogethers that offer educational value and cost no money. These free resources can even help save money on other types of entertainment. Taking a car full of kids to see a summer movie can get extremely expensive. Fortunately, many libraries offer films or other media for free or very little cost, providing a replacement activity at a fraction of the expense.

# AN INTERVIEW WITH VICTORIA HYLA MALDONADO

The road to becoming an author has many paths.

For Victoria Hyla Maldonado, her journey started because of a crush she had at the age of 15. Her first book - In Death We Part - was started when her crush asked for a book himself. Victoria about mentioned "I didn't work on it all the time, sometimes not for years at a time, and I actually lost the majority of it in a power-surge computer crash once." At the age of 31, the book was published. "It grew up with me," she stated, "and I published it when I was ready to give it wings."

Victoria Hyla Maldonado, also published under Victoria J. Hyla, grew up in Illinois, USA. She loved writing from a very young age, and has always wanted to become an author. Along the way, she has been an editor as well as written articles for magazines and websites. Victoria's favorite is still an author, as she "really get[s] to express [herself] and what [she] uniquely bring[s] to the world."

Victoria bases her stories off of her own life experiences. These are sometimes based off of what she has done, who she has met, or the idea of how her life would be different if she had made a different choice. She mentioned "I think writing that stems from what I've seen in this world keeps it grounded and yet offers me vast creativity to explore beyond what 'is.'"

Victoria has currently published eight books: <u>In</u>
<u>Death We Part</u>, <u>Running in the Mists</u>, and
Awake in Elysian Fields from her Hearts

Drawn Wyld trilogy, two children's books: Bartleby the Brave (as well as a Spanish version, Miedosin el Valiente), and Tears for the Butterfly (and it's Spanish counterpart, Lágrimas para la Mariposa), as well as a posthumously poetry anthology, The Evidence I Have Lived: The Complete Writings of Lisa F. Gullo".

The anthology was created to remember her dearly departed friend, and is an epic, intimate journal of her life struggles. Victoria wrote the introduction, as well as compiled and organized the writing within. This book was published in hopes of

helping Lisa's family offset the crippling medical debt she left behind.

Victoria is currently working on Monstery Donstery Dock, which is a monster twist on Hickory Dickory Dock and will be released for Halloween, as well as a second book to Bartleby the Brave and a new trilogy called The Hotel Brisas.

Two of Victoria's books - <u>Awake in Elysian Fields</u> and <u>The Evidence I Have Lived</u> - received nominations for the 2020 American Book Fest Award. Additionally, Victoria informed us that she has been on several industry podcasts, had her interviews published online and in magazines, and has been on the radio. Her children books have

been read online and in podcasts, as well. Her website (www.victoriajhyla.com) has more detailed information about the global exposure that she and her books have received.

Victoria hopes that one day, she will be able to participate in speaking engagements where she can tell the story of her journey in her faith, and what it's meant to her. Other than that, she let us know that she is already doing what she loves, and would love to be able to become an author full time.

Victoria enjoys many books, especially classics, written by a wide variety of authors. When asked if she has a favorite, she replied: "Every brings something author...

interesting into the world of literature... that leaves an iconic shift in culture in its wake." In addition to loving books, she also loves movies, including Labyrinth, The Never Ending Story, The Princess Bride, Book of Life, Moana, and many more. Her favorite play to watch is Hamilton, though she also enjoys The Wizard of Oz, The Sound of Music, and 1776, and has been attending theater since she was five.

One of Victoria's favorite things to do in her spare

time is to travel. She has been to 43 states so far, and is hoping to visit all 50 of them. She always travels with a Fu Dog statue, and will take pictures of him doing interesting things in odd places. Her Fu Dog even has a blog, found In her travels, here. Victoria has been skydiving, completed the Chicago Marathon, and knows Paris better than her hometown

Chicago. Each time she travels to a foreign country, she takes the time to learn their language enough for directions, stores, transport, and to be polite, even when she was visiting Croatia for a few hours.

> Some other hobbies Victoria enjoys are cooking, playing piano, directing theater, and leading her Alpha group at church. She mentioned that she did Aikido - a type of martial art - for six years, but had to stop due to time, money, and arthritis.

When asked if there was anything she wanted her fans to know, she told us a few interesting facts about herself. She said, "I absolutely despise mushrooms. terrified of spiders, even fakes ones and pictures. My favorite ice

cream flavor is Mamey. My favorite sushi is Super White Tuna."

Victoria loves the idea of others becoming authors, and had this advice to anyone looking to publish a book: "Tell your story, not a copy of someone else's. As long as it comes from you, it has worth. And just keep writing and keep plugging along. The best solution I have for writer's block is getting up and walking around and doing something mundane. Generally in that passive thinking time is

when inspiration strikes me, and I can write it down or rush back to my computer." She also has found herself on the inside of a new publishing company as the chief editor. and mentioned, "As far as publishing, there are a lot of options out there. Our publishing company will look at anything, and we will let you know if it needs work or just minor edits."

#### Nonograms


To solve a nonogram, you will need to fill in cells to produce a black-and-white image based on the numbers provided in the grid.

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#### Zig Zag

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


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
